VOCABULARY

Apostasy: An abandoning of one has believed in, as in a faith or principle.

Aristotle: 384–322 B.C. Greek philosopher

Agnostics: a person who believes that the human mind cannot know whether there is a God.

Cerinthus: 50-100 A.D. early Gnostic who was at odds with John, the Apostle.

Deus ex machina: a Greek phrase meaning, "a god from a machine."

Dispensational Theology: Pre-tribulation rapture doctrine, end of times. Introduced in the 19th century by John Nelson Darby. (Ligonier.org)

Dominion theology: urges Christians to take positions of authority throughout the world to convert world into Christianity and wait for Jesus' return. (cam.org)

Eschatology: Theology concerned with the end of the world.

Heretic: a person who differs in opinion from established religious dogma.

Inductive Bible Study: Inductive Bible Study is a method of studying Scripture that seeks to find meaning in the original context and apply it to everyday life today.

Josephus: 37-100 A.D. Jewish historian

Orthodox view: Conforming to an established doctrine.

Pre tribe Rapture:

Rapture: the final assumption of Christians into Heaven.

Revelation: Something that is revealed by God to humans, enlightenment

Synagogue: A house of worship for a Jewish congregation.

Episunagoge: the religious assembly of Christians. (biblestudytools.com)

Torah: The whole body of Jewish Scriptures.
